

TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS: Pages 101-105

Additional Options Under TIO Rule: Relief for intervention by the following TV towers may be taken on either side of the tower in accordance with the Rule.

- (a) To the right of Hole 2 approximately 100 yards from the 2nd putting green.
- (b) To the rear of the 4th putting green.
- (c) To the rear of the 10th putting green.

TURF PLUGS ON PUTTING GREEN: Turf plugs on putting greens have the same status as old hole plugs and may be repaired as provided in Rule 16-1c.

WATER HAZARDS:

- (a) Ball in Water Hazard: A ball may be put in play under Rule 26 or, as an additional option, a ball may be dropped under penalty of one stroke on the ball drop on the following holes:
 - Hole 11: Short of Water Hazard
 - Hole 12: Short of Water Hazard
 - Hole 13: Short of Water Hazard
 - Hole 15: Short of Water Hazard
 - Hole 16: On front of tee
- (b) The Water Hazard behind the 15th green is defined as a Lateral Water Hazard in the play of Hole 15.
- (c) Ball in Lateral Water Hazard: A ball may be put in play under Rule 26. The ball drops on Holes 11, 12, 13, 15 and 16 may not be used as a relief option.

Note: The two grass walkways within the Water Hazard left and right of the green on Hole 13 are considered "ground in the hazard." Rule 13-4 applies.

CONDITIONS OF THE COMPETITION

PACE OF PLAY (Note 2 to Rule 6-7): Page 108. Separate memorandum, Pace of Play Policy, has been given to all players and is posted in the locker room.

PRACTICE BETWEEN HOLES (Note 2 to Rule 7-2): Pages 109-110

SPECIFICATIONS OF EQUIPMENT:

- (a) **List of Conforming Driver Heads:** Page 106

SUSPENSION OF PLAY DUE TO A DANGEROUS SITUATION (Note to Rule 6-8b): Page 109. During suspension for a dangerous situation, all practice areas are closed until the Committee has declared them open.

TIME OF STARTING (Note to Rule 6-3a): Pages 107-108

TRANSPORTATION: Pages 110-111. Exception: When permitted by the Committee.

PLAY-OFF: In the event of a tie after 72 holes, those tied will continue play immediately on a hole-by-hole play-off beginning on the 18th hole and continuing on the 10th and 18th holes in sequence until a winner is determined.

CLOSE OF COMPETITION (Rule 34-1b): The competition is officially closed when the Green Jacket has first been presented to the winner.

LOCAL RULES

ABNORMAL GROUND CONDITIONS:

Ground Under Repair:

- (a) Includes gallery crossways, when lined with white or green paint.
- (b) For lie of ball or area of intended swing only: Sod seams when located through the green. All seams within the sodded area are considered the same seam.
- (c) May include areas of unusual damage caused by automotive equipment or spectators, but only when so ruled by a Rules Rover.

CASUAL WATER ON THE PUTTING GREEN: If casual water exists on the putting green, the Committee may:

- (a) Squeegee the putting green until the players are near the putting green.
- (b) Require the player to take relief under Rule 25-1b (iii).
- (c) Squeegee the line of putt when the player's ball lies on the putting green. Such squeegeeing must extend beyond the hole.
- (d) Or in extreme cases, any combination of a, b or c above.

EMBEDDED BALL THROUGH THE GREEN: Page 98

INTEGRAL PARTS OF THE COURSE:

- (a) Any cable supporting a tree branch.
- (b) Plastic liners in bunkers.
- (c) **Retaining walls when located** within water hazards.
- (d) Wires, cables, rods and protection plates closely attached to trees.

LIMITS DEFINED:

- (a) Ground Under Repair – White lines.
- (b) Lateral Water Hazard – When defined on only one side, it is deemed to extend to infinity.
- (c) Out of Bounds – Fence posts (inside edge at ground level) on Holes 4, 5, 11 and 12. On Hole 4 beyond the green, out of bounds also is defined by white stakes (inside edge at ground level).
